The Junior Olympiad and Kangaroo are the follow-on rounds for the Junior Mathematical Challenge and are organised by the UK Mathematics Trust. The top scoring 1200 or so JMC pupils are invited to participate in the Junior Mathematical Olympiad, and the next 6000 are invited to participate in the Junior Kangaroo.

The Olympiad is a two-hour examination with two sections. Section A contains ten questions to which only answers are required, but which require careful thought. Section B contains six questions; candidates are required to write fully detailed solutions. The knowledge and skills required are often beyond the range of normal school work and outstandingly successful candidates will receive a medal.

The one-hour multiple choice Junior Kangaroo requires the use of logic as well as mathematical understanding to solve amusing and thought-provoking questions.

The UK Mathematics Trust is a registered educational charity, founded in 1996, with a small professional core of administrators, but with much of the work done by several hundred volunteers, mostly school teachers, university students and academics.
